### About the PPRI EECA network



- A collaboration of pharmaceutical pricing and reimbursement authorities of countries in the Eastern European and Central Asian (EECA) region
- Established in 2017 on initiative of **WHO Regional Office for Europe** and **GÖG** (Austrian National Public Health Institute/WHO Collaborating Centre for Pharmaceutical Pricing and Reimbursement Policies in Vienna)
- Spin-off of the larger PPRI network
- Working language is Russian
- Members are **PUBLIC** institutions with a competence for pharmaceutical pricing and/or reimbursement, e.g. National Medicines Regulatory Authority, Ministries of Health, Procurement Agency, Ministry of Finance,...
- Informal network based on trust; it lives from the commitment of its members

- to collect a <u>price</u> of products or active ingredients
- to learn about the <u>reimbursement status</u> of products or active ingredients
- to collect consumption data of products or active ingredients
- related to other issues within pharmaceutical system







# Example: Administration of COVID-19 vaccination in community pharmacies

- Date: January 2021
- Launched by: PPRI Secretariat at the Austrian National Public Health Institute (GÖG)
- Purpose of the query: In Austria, vaccination in community pharmacies is not allowed. With the preparatory work on the COVID-19 vaccination, this topic has gained momentum, and policy-makers are interested in learning about the situation in other countries:
- Research question: Which PPRI countries provide or will provide the COVID-19 vaccination in community pharmacies (as part of the overall policy question on vaccination in pharmacies)?
- Answered by: 22 countries (AL, AT, BG, BR, CA, DE, DK, EL, FI, HU, IE, IL, LT, LV, MT, NL, PL, PT, RO, SA, SE, TR)





# Example: Administration of COVID-19 vaccination in community pharmacies - Results

	COVID-19 vaccination currently <b>not</b> allowed (January 2021)	COVID-19 vaccination allowed
Vaccination in community pharmacies not allowed	Albania, Austria, Bulgaria, Brazil, Germany, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland**, Romania, Saudi Arabia, Turkey	
Vaccination in community pharmacies is allowed	Denmark, Finland, Greece, Israel, Malta, Netherlands, Portugal**	Canada*, Ireland, Sweden***

<sup>\*</sup> Canada: The vaccine is not being administered through pharmacies while it is being prioritized to defined (risk) populations. Provincial and territorial governments are responsible for determining the process of distributing the COVID-19 vaccination to their respective populations, and may decide to provide it through pharmacies in the future.

Special requirements when administering the vaccines in community pharmacies:

Denmark, Ireland, Israel, Portugal, – Trained personnel (pharmacist)

Finland, Sweden – allowed if administered by physicians, no vaccination by pharmacist and Reimbursement Policies





<sup>\*\*</sup> Countries were thinking of administering COVID-19 vaccinations in community pharmacies at a later stage, but no final decision taken yet: Poland, Portugal

<sup>\*\*\*</sup> Vaccination in community pharmacies allowed if administered by physicians and nurses, no vaccination by pharmacists. Changes are planned.

- Please inform the PPRI EECA secretariat about the publication!






