E V E L O P M E N T S	The following measures are implemented in pricing of non-reimbursed medicinal products:For expensive non-reimbursed medicinal products, which price is higher than 300 euro VAT tariff is 5 % (other non-reimbursed drugs – VAT 21 %)In the nearest future will be implemented some amendments in reimbursed medicines pricing:The most expensive product in the group must not exceed 10 % of the average price of product in the reference countries, if the group contains more than 2 trade names	Since the end of April, 2017 will be reimbursed medicinal products used in the in vitro fertilization (IVF) procedure.
