- ⇒ Government has made general agreement with both medical specialists and general practitioners on cost-effective prescribing of certain groups of medicines (e.g. proton pump inhibitors, statins, ACE inhibitors); when these groups don't meet their targets their fees might be set at a lower level
- Some health insurance funds offer general prescribers financial incentives for cost effective prescribing
- ⇒ Reimbursement lists for out-patient sector

Regulatory strategies:

- ⇒ Preference policy of health insurance funds: When generic substitution is possible, a health insurer is allowed to select only one specific brand per active substance for reimbursement
- ⇒ For certain groups of (expensive) medicines, prescription is limited to specified indications
- ⇒ Rational Pharmacotherapy programme aims to make the use of available medicines safer, more effective and efficient.
- ⇒ A monitor on the therapeutical complaints has been introduced.

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
