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Pricing

Price policies for pharmaceuticals Maximum price law for non-reimbursable and reimbursable products: external reference pricing (Belgium, France, Germany and UK) since 1996.

OTC pharmaceuticals have no maximum price.

• Wholesale Mark-ups

The government does not know the markups.

Pharmacy Mark-ups

Maximum dispensing fee € 6,10 per prescription

Claw back 6,82% of public list price with a maximum of €6,80 per prescription.

VAT

19% standard rate

6% rate on pharmaceuticals

Reforms

Since 2004 there is an agreement between innovative industry, generic industry, pharmacists, health insurers and the Ministry of Health. This agreement implies a price cut of 40% for those pharmaceuticals of which there are generics and multisource available. Competition between parties is being encouraged.

Reimbursement

• Positive / negative list

Approximately 71% of all pharmaceuticals on the market are fully reimbursed. Of which 31% are generics.

Reference Price System
 Internal reference pricing since 1992.

For cost-effective products with added therapeutic value, there is premium pricing.

- Co-payment Negligible, less than 0,5%
- Mechanisms for vulnerable groups
 Some non-reimbursable drugs are reimbursed for chronically-ill patients.
