P M E N T		- It is planned to implement the reimbursement approval process (that is now performed by the MoH) also for a broader scope of medical devices such as lens or adult diapers. Thereby medical devices will be subjected to assessment of polish HTA agency and to price negotiation with the Economic Commission affiliated with the MoH Health.
S		- Similar changes considering reimbursement approval process, assessment of polish HTA agency, and price negotiation will apply to drugs for HIV, AIDS treatments as well as to drugs used in haemophilia treatment
	OTHER CHANGES  The reimbursement approval process that is performed by the polish MoH requires pharmaceutical companies to complete a reimbursement submission form. From 1 January 2017 entire process including submitting applications, assessment of polish HTA agency, price negotiation with the Economic Commission will be performed on-line via new IT system called SOLR (System of reimbursement list service).
