OTHERS CHANGES

- 01/12/2017: Implementation of the amendment relating to re-export regulation, mandatory MAHs delivery reports and pharmacydistributor-MAH relations adjustment
- 01/01/2018: Mandatory electronic prescription
- 01/01/2018: Reimbursement of vaccination against human papillomavirus for boys; vaccination against invasive meningococcal infections, pneumococcal infections, invasive disease caused by Haemophilus influenzae type b and influenza for specific types of patients; vaccination against pneumococcal infections for persons above 65 years following by the recommendation of the National Immunization Committee

SPECIAL TOPIC: HOSPITAL MEDICINES

Procurement:

- o By hospitals themselves or groups of hospitals (rare)
- o Since 01/07/2017, some hospitals purchase contracts must be listed in public Registry of Contracts
- o Real purchasing prices might differ due to application of reverse bonuses or similar discounts (not published)
- o Negotiations and tendering procedures
- Financing/reimbursement:
 - o Agreements between hospitals and health insurance companies
 - o Hospital pharmaceutical formulary these are fully reimbursed
- **HTA:** N/A
- Interface management:
 - o During in-patient care all pharmacotherapy is provided by the hospital
 - Prescribed medicines may be changed in the out-patient sector and vice versa if not disallowed by prescription restrictions
- Main challenges in 2017: Discussion about optional above-standard care
- In-patient pharmaceutical expenditure: 15.20 per cent of hospital cost <u>www.uzis.cz</u> (2015) (estimate to 19 per cent of out-patient pharma., incl. out-patient hospital care)
