## Major reforms from 2007 till now

- Extension of the reference price system to post-patent molecules without generic alternatives (at the request of the Reimbursement Committee) - 01/2007
- Introduction of the shorter, administrative procedure for generics - 04/2007
- Reform reference price system: increased frequency (4x/year) & extra 2,5% decrease of reimbursement level 2 years after initial reference price system entry – 05/2009


#### **Current and planned measures**

- New remuneration system for pharmacists (under implementation - should enter in force in 01/2010)
- Alternative ways of reimbursement (e.g. "contracts")
- Doctors/pharmacists are encouraged to prescribe/deliver more so-called "cheap drugs" (implemented for doctors 01/2009 pilot project for pharmacists autumn 2009)

### Current pharmaceutical pricing and reimbursement system (as of 2/2009)

#### **Pricing**

- Price policies for pharmaceuticals price regulation for all pharmaceuticals (statutory pricing - maximum price fixinternal & external price referencing
- **Price structure**



6% on pharmaceuticals

#### Reimbursement

- **Positive list** 
  - 5619 reimbursable pharmaceuticals (Medicinal Product Packing)
- Reference Price System Introduced on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2001
- Co-payment
  - system of third party payment → percentage co-payment (with 'ceiling'-fee) depending on reimbursement category

Maximum invoice (low income)

Mechanisms for vulnerable groups preferential reimbursement status for Widows, Orphans, Retired persons and Disabled persons + low income
