Recent changes in pharmaceutical policy measures and developments in pharmaceutical expenditure

Major changes in pharmaceutical policy in 2012-2013

Pricing

The Coalition Government undertook to honour the five year 2009 Pharmaceutical Price Regulation Scheme (PPRS) agreement for branded medicines.

No changes in 2012 or any planned for 2013.

Reimbursement

No changes in 2012 or any planned for 2013.

Other changes

The NHS prescription charge in England will increase to £7.85 for each quantity of a drug or appliance from 1 April 2013.


However, the cost of prescription prepayment certificates remain at £29.10 for a 3 month certificate and £104 for an annual certificate.

Outlook

Negotiations are underway between government and the pharmaceutical industry on new pricing arrangements for branded medicines including valuebased pricing to be introduced from 1 January 2014.
