About PPRI: The history



Framework

- Research project
- Funded from April 2005 October 2007 by European Commission, DG SANCO, co-funded by the Austrian Ministry of Health
- Project leader: Austrian Health Institute (GÖG)
 Associated partner: WHO, Regional Office for Europe
- From 2008 on: the network continues on a voluntary basis, PPRI Secretariat with GÖG

Objective

 improve knowledge and promotes information exchange about the outpatient pharmaceutical systems in the enlarged Europe

Results:

- PPRI Pharma Profiles
- Glossary
- Indicators
- Comparable analysis: PPRI Report
- Network: Regular personal exchange at meetings
- Follow up activities PHIS project (2008 2011)
 - Exploring medicine management in the hospital sector
 - Medicine prices in hospitals (discounts, rebates, ...)
 - Interface management


About PPRI: developments

- Network: growing, however only competent authorities (and European / international organisations are allowed to join)
 - PPRI Sub-Group on Medical Devices (since 2018)
 - PPRI EECA (Eastern Europe and Central Asia) (launched 2017)
 - PPRI Africa (pilot initiative in 2025)

- Procedural issues (e.g., for joining), for PPRI network queries


Visibility to "external parties"

- Publication of information (e.g. country information) of general interest
- Research publications based on PPRI information

About PPRI: The network is at the centre

Interaction and exchange of information at the PPRI network meetings

- 2-day meetings
- Rotation principle: hosted by national PPRI network member (if onsite)

Content

- PPRI secretariat is in charge of the agenda except for country session
- One or two overall topics
- Poster session with country presentations
- A session presenting examples of PPRI network queries
- Interactive session with group work
- Importance of breaks and social dinner
- External people may be invited for the country session; opportunity for staff of network member to get involved
- Travel and accommodation costs are covered by the PPRI network members

- (Hosting a meeting)


Participation in PPRI network queries

- Translate the glossary in your language











Joining PPRI – procedural issues



- after approval reply from PPRI via email with access to PPRI Intranet (username & password), information about Intranet and data protection declaration (screenshot on the left)
- if included in Network Query Mailing List: separate e-mail about procedural issues related to network queries








PPRI Network queries

- **Purpose**: to have <u>quick access</u> to information and data on specific questions in other countries
- Topics, e.g.:
 - to collect a <u>price</u> of products or active ingredients
 - to learn about the <u>reimbursement status</u> of products or active ingredients
 - to collect <u>consumption data</u> of products or active ingredients
 - related to <u>other issues</u> within pharmaceutical system
- Where to find information to launch a query?










How to launch a PPRI network query...








Overview of the guiding principles

- ☑ Check previous compilations
- ☑ Use the latest version of the PPRI mailing list
- ☑ Copy in ppri@goeg.at (also in replies!)
- ☑ Use the appropriate template
- ☑ Explain the purpose of the query
- ☑ Provide an example (with own country data)
- ☑ Set deadlines (usually two weeks)
- ☑ Prepare and share a compilation






Compilations of replies to a query












PPRI Indicators: a dashboard was built Examples of PPRI indicators

External Price Referencing

- Indicator: Use of EPR
- Indicator: Methodology to determine the reference price under EPR
- Indicator: Number of reference countries
- Indicator: Scope of EPR (sectors covered)

Reimbursement rates

- Indicator: Reimbursement rates of medicines in the outpatient sector
- Indicator: Reimbursement rates of medicines in the inpatient sector

Co-payments

- Indicator: Co-payments for funded medicines in outpatient sector
- Indicator: Types of co-payments for funded medicines in outpatient sector

Reference Price System

- Indicator: Reference price system in place
- Indicator: Cluster of reference groups
- Indicator: Calculation of reference prices


Understanding the concept (glossary)

The indicator describes which PPRI countries regulate the prices of generic medicines by setting the price of a generic at a defined amount (e.g., percentage) lower than the price of the originator medicine.
